With concerns about in-person contact, the bureau delayed most visits until August and has extended the deadline to complete the count until October 31. Why is completing the census so important? The census count determines the amount of federal funds your state receives for hospitals and schools, and it determines the allocation of representatives in Congress, which must be based on equal populations. Remember, all state legislatures will in 2021 to draw meet new congressional districts for the 2022 election, and every vote counts!

Civic Engagement & Outreach:

November 3, 2020 is Election Day

and we all want to vote safely and avoid exposure to CV-19. Alternatives to voting alongside the general public include Voting by Mail and Early Voting.

Voting By Mail

Voting by mail is an easy option for voters and you can request a vote by mail ballot through email, mail, or in person. An application was probably mailed to you already. It is also available from the DuPage Election authority or at <u>https://www.dupageco.org/Elect</u> ion/.

Mail Ballots will begin being mailed to voters September 24, 2020, and it may take 4-5 business days to receive your ballot. Your Mail Ballot must be completed, **SIGNED**, returned, and postmarked no later than November 3, 2020.

You may also drop off your voter ballot at the DuPage County Clerk Election Division office, at drop boxes located at the parking lot and main entrance of the Jack T. Knuepfer Administration Building, 421 N County Farm Road, Wheaton, or at drop boxes located within all DuPage County Early Voting Sites and Polling Places.

Questions can be directed to the County Clerk's office at **630-407-5600**. It has been suggested that you mail your ballot no later than October 20 to ensure it reaches the county by November 3. You can track your Vote by Mail Ballot at the link above and also apply to be an election judge. The county has just doubled the amount paid to election judges due to the shortage of judges.

The State of Illinois, the DuPage County Election Commission, and the United States Post Office have voiced opinions recommending Vote By Mail. The concerns over fraud are overstated according to studies done MIT. Stanford. and other bv institutions. According to these institutions, voting by mail doesn't benefit any political party over another. For more information please see the following links:

In-Person Early Voting

Early voting begins between September 24 & October 19, depending upon the location you choose. Check the website listed in the next column for more information.

Once ready to vote, election workers verify the voter's registration status by accessing a central database housed at the DuPage County Election Division. If the voter is not registered, he/she must register at the appropriate area in the Early Voting location.

Once validated as a registered voter, the database is updated (preventing the voter from voting at another location). The voter is allowed to cast a ballot using an ATM-like touchscreen device. Votes are tabulated once the polls close on Election Day.
