During WW2, over 1100 women, led by Jackie Cochran, the "Speed Queen"; served their country by flying every military aircraft in the American Armed Forces from the PT-17 Stearman to the P51 Mustang and the B-17 Flying Fortress. Air ferry missions, target practice for artillery crews, and the aircraft maintenance shakedown flights are just a few of the types of missions flown by these American Heroines. I'm very excited to have Rebecca, a certified FAA pilot herself, tell the story of the Fly Girls of WW2 as only a pilot can.

The Women's Club of Ukraine Endures through Challenging Times

GFWC Website February 10, 2022

Members of the International Women's Club of Ukraine (Kyiv) are staying strong as they endure trying times. In January, Russia stationed more than 100,000 military troops near the Ukrainian border, despite warnings from other world leaders.

Clubwoman Lora Pavlenko explained club members and other citizens are once again in a strict quarantine zone and are facing fear over what the future holds. In addition to the possibility of invasion, the price of food and medicine has risen several times. Clubwomen are urging everyone to stand together and offer help to those in need when they are able. During these times of uncertainty, international members have been doing what they can to give people hope, including meeting monthly with women survivors of domestic violence, providing gifts to children at the holidays, and supporting children with disabilities.

New screening blood tests on the horizon!

CancerSEEK and DELFI are two new blood tests currently in development whose aim is to provide a better and less invasive way of finding cancers early on. These tests are designed to screen and detect various cancers including ovarian which now does not have a screening tool.

Although these are new tests, they have an over three decades of cancer genetic research at the Johns Hopkins Kimmel Cancer Center, a most reputable institution behind them. There is a need for noninvasive cancer screening tests as many people opt out of screening currently because of worries about complications from invasive procedures. A non-invasive blood test could at some point be administered by a primary care doctor as part of a routine blood work.

Both these tests use a liquid biopsy technology that enables cancer detection related to DNA circulating in one's bloodstream. The CancerSEEK blood test seeks out the presence of mutations and blood levels of certain cancer proteins. Currently the screening is targeted for ovarian, breast, lung, pancreatic, colorectal, esophageal, liver, and stomach cancers. The DELFI test stands for DNA evaluation of fragments for early interception and it seeks to see the way DNA is formed inside the nucleus of a cell.

This synopsis of this new research is from an article currently in the GFWC Clubwoman Magazine, Winter 2022, which is attached. The article goes into greater depth on this research and I believe is well worth reading. Check it out!
